## About Tung Ping Chau



Tung Ping Chau is a remote but stunning island, situated in the northeastern corner of Mirs Bay. Forty years ago there were hundreds of villagers on the island, and now it is mostly visited by weekend tourists. Tung Ping Chau is a great place to learn about nature and ecology. The sedimentary rocks on the island have recorded a fascinating history of biogenic



evolution. A rich assemblage of organisms could be observed in the tidal pools and rocky shores beautifully exposed on the island. The area has been designated a Global Geopark. Participants will have a chance to experience first-hand issues concerning sustainable tourism.



## **About Prof. Chan Lung Sang**

Prof Chan Lung Sang of the Department of Earth Sciences at HKU and currently serving as the principal of HKUSPACE Community College and HKUSPACE-PLK Stanley Ho Community College. He received his bachelor degree from CUHK and his Masters and PhD in geology from University of California-Berkeley, becoming arguably the first Hong Kong native to receive a formal training in geology. He taught geology at the University of Wisconsin for 10 years before he joined The University of Hong Kong 20 years ago. His research interests include the tectonics and geology of South China and geophysics. He actively engages himself in the promotion of earth sciences. He chaired the Geological Society for the period 2001-2005 and was invited to be a guest host in the TVB shows 'The Vanishing Glacier' in 2008 and the 'Water of Life' in 2011. He was bestowed by The University of Hong Kong in 2010 the first University Distinguished Teaching Award, the highest honour given by the University to teachers.

陳龍生現為香港大學地球科學系教授。現任香港大學附屬學院及港大-保良局社區書院校長。他是中文大學畢業生，之後獲得加州柏克萊大學之碩士及哲學博士學位。算得上是香港首位土生土長的地質專家。曾任教美國威斯康辛大學。1994年回港任教香港大學。他的研究範疇包括應用地球物理學、地震地質及香港和南中國之板塊運動。2010年獲香港大學頒授第一屆卓越教學獎。他有豐富野外研究經驗，曾經帶香港學生到美國、塞浦路斯、意大利、臺灣、澳洲、西藏、南極及北極圈等地進行地質考察。也曾為香港電視台在「冰天動地」、「水之源」、「地震專輯」等節目中當嘉賓主持。
