

Both Jesuit Fathers were dedicated educators with a strong determination to serve others. Fr. Naylor and Fr. Deignan undoubtedly inspired generations of Wahyanites with unconditional love and care. Their legacies will live on for many years. Wahyanites will miss them.

In the morning of 11 October (Thursday), a funeral mass was arranged for Fr. Naylor at St. Ignatius Chapel of WYK and the School Hall. In addition, a memorial mass was arranged in the afternoon of 20 October (Saturday) at St. Ignatius Chapel of WYK to honour Fr. Naylor.


The funeral mass for Fr. Deignan was also held at St. Ignatius Chapel and the School Hall on 22 December (Saturday). Fr. Stephen Chow, who happens to be mentee of Fr. Deignan in education and vocation as a Jesuit, delivered a note to commemorate Fr. Deignan.

In both times, the whole school was throughd with friends and relatives, staff of the school, former and current students, and people from the community paying respects to Fr. Naylor and Fr. Deignan.

The Ontario Alumni Chapters of Wah Yan College, Hong Kong and Wah Yan College, Kowloon held a memorial mass for the Late Rev. Fr. A.J. Deignan SJ on 19th January 2019 at the Holy Spirit Roman Catholic Church, Scarborough, Ontario.

The passing of Fr. Deignan marks the end of an era of the wave of Irish Jesuits on their China Mission since 1926. The Memorial Mass was a fine opportunity for alumni of both Wah Yans and Ricci Hall to say thank you.







Aviation Fraternity Calling for Members


