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STUDENT AMBASSADORS

This year's Student Ambassador Scheme comes with the 7-day visit to New York City (NYC) in July 2026 by, for the first time, FOUR Student Ambassadors – 3 of WYK and 1 of WYHK, who are hosted by Wah Yan College Alumni of Eastern US. In an interview on their recent visits, Gavin Ng, Hinki Tsui (both of WYK'24), and Anson Tam (WYK'27) have presented informative and reflective accounts.

The trio WYKnites joined the scheme out of curiosity and encouragement by senior alumni. Gavin was encouraged by former PSA chairperson Cedric Ko (WYK'94), while Anson and Hinki both planned to experience the strong global bonding of alumni through the broad scope of activities.

After being selected as our Ambassadors, they faced the first hurdle in preparation for the trip - the application of the US Visitor Visa. The visa application of one of them was rejected in his first submission, which is almost unheard of in the past, but his better documentation got the application approved in the second attempt. With visas settled, Gavin was briefed on the trip by James Wong (one of the hosts of Eastern US), Hinki and Anson recalled the logistics relating to tickets, accommodation, all of which were assisted by various hosts. The second hurdle in this trip was accommodation: thanks to the trip's coincidence with the finals of the World Cup in NYC, which sent the cost of accommodation in hotels skyrocketing there, Ambassadors took on the adventure of sleeping in a room of bunkers, which is common among young global travelers on vacation. They found the experience of such accommodation as eye-opening as their visits to many places.



Gavin, Hinki, and Anson may have different places to visit as their own achievements - with Gavin pinpointing Central Park, Grant's Tomb; Hinki the museums; Anson the architectural highlights. However, the visits common to them are no less important: The Metropolitan Museum of Art, Staten Island Ferry, Columbia University, The Museum of Natural History, Brooklyn Street, Broadway, Grand Central Station, National 9/11 Memorial and Museum, Harry Potter Shop, Times Square, Hudson Yards, Bloomberg Bridge, The Museum of Modern Art (MoMA). Also, our alumni in NYC tailored some of their visits: Eric Lau (WYK'03), an artist and a designer with exhibits in the US and Hong Kong now residing in NYC, introduced to them the graffiti in Brooklyn, the defining street art on facades of buildings in the area. Hinki recalled the visit to the global financial news provider Bloomberg, arranged by

Nelson Yu (WYK'05) working there.



Reflection comes commonly with travel, and our three Ambassadors have enriched their visits with some deep thought, partly related to our Jesuit education of 'being men for and with others'. Gavin gave thought to his visit to Grant's Tomb (of a former US President), next to Columbia University: an accompanying portrait of two men shaking hands highlights the message of no war but peace. Hinki recollected his empathy to the homeless

sleeping on benches nightly in Central Park, relating the shortage of housing to such a disturbing scene, looking for ways of helping them. Anson recounted his observation of the Harlem area to gain a better understanding of the life of the socially and financially disadvantaged as well as the ways of serving them.

A trip of this nature cannot be accomplished without the primary message from WYK – the goings-on of WYK - to the hosts. Current student Anson undertook this task with ease; the other Ambassadors helped the Eastern US chapter relay to WYK the message of the importance of strong brotherhood connecting their chapter with WYK, regardless of physical distance.

Our Ambassadors have enjoyed the visit to NYC: they wish to thank the Wah Yan College Alumni of Eastern US for the hospitality; they wish the trip had been longer by at least 1 or 2 more days, and wish the future applicants of the program luck with the following advice: active participation in as many activities on campus as one can to be ready to present them comfortably to hosts; during the interview that screens applicants for the program: Relax.
